1 Overview of the Institution:

Dow Institute of Nursing and Midwifery is a part of Dow University of Health Sciences. It was established in 2006. The task force for establishment of Institute of Nursing & Midwifery played a very important role in planning and establishment of this institute. Our primary objective is to produce quality healthcare professionals through Bachelors of Nursing Program (BSN Generic) Post RN BSN, Post RN BSM and Masters in Nursing Programs. The task force was chaired by Vice Chancellor and the members included nursing professionals, senior teachers from both public and private sectors. The Dow Institute of Nursing and Midwifery is situated within the Ojha sub-campusof DUHS with a well-constructed building, and a conducive environment for teaching and learning.

After being established in 2003, Dow University of Health Sciences (DUHS) established the "Dow Institute of Nursing and Midwifery" with the support of Higher Education Commission, Pakistan (HEC). The foundation laying stone ceremony of the nursing institute was held on June 3rd, 2006 at the Ojha sub-Campus of Dow University of Health Sciences. The Chief Guest tothe ceremony was Prof. Atta Ur Rehman, Advisor Federal Government, and Chairman Higher Education Commission. Completion period of the project was two years while the basic aim of the institution is to fulfill the acute shortage of skilled nurses in countryby providing quality education and hands on nursing skills.

4 DIONAM Facilities

4.1 Hostel:

Hostel facility is provided only for female students on a need to need basis. The hostel is facilitated with the regular necessities and luxuries needed by the students.

4.1.1 General Rules and Regulation

- 4.1.1.1 No visitors are allowed to stay overnight inside the hostel.
- 4.1.1.2 No Hostilities will be allowed to enter or leave the hostel premises after 10.00 PM
- 4.1.1.3 Weekly visit will be done to assess the cleanliness of hostel rooms.
- 4.1.1.4 Its mandatory to follow all these rules and regulations
- 4.1.1.5 Any of the hostilities, if found violating above rule may directly ask to leave thehostel.

4.2 Transportation

The transportation service will be provided by DIONAM to the students and pick and drop service from the allocated pickup points at scheduled time. Students are not required to stay in after institute hours. But if they desire, for study purposes, they should make their own transportation arrangement. Students of DIONAM, DUHS will have to pay transport fees.

4.3 Financial Assistance

Any student requiring Finical Aid notifies the competent authority. The committee will review each case on individual basis will decide for financial assistance.

4.4 Learning Resources

DIONAM has a nursing skill laboratory, a science laboratory, computer lab several class rooms, conference room, as well as tutorial rooms.

4.4.1 Furnished Classrooms

Well furnished classrooms equipped with the latest teaching aids, such as multimedia with internet facilities etc are available to have highly interactive sessions in classroom teaching. All classrooms are well-illuminated, properly ventilated, air conditioned and with modern seating.

4.4.2 Nursing Skill Lab

This is a practical learning resource in DIONAM which allows students to practice master nursing skills in patient care situations. The skill lab physical layout accommodates various learning area and stations according to the need of students.

- 4.4.2.1 The skill lab is open from 8:30 to 15:00 hours, Monday till Thursday and Saturday, Timings for Friday are 8:30 to 12:00. Skill Lab Manager, Faculty and staff are available for student's assistance.
- 4.4.2.2 Students are requested to fill out the application before obtaining any equipmentfrom skill lab.
 - 4.4.2.3 Students are responsible for leaving the skill lab neat and clean.
- 4.4.2.4 In case of damage/loss of skill lab property replacement cost must be paid or same item will be replaced by the person responsible for the damage.





4.4.3 Science Lab

The science lab at DIONAM is located on the 1st floor. The lab is practical resourcefor students which allow them to learn and understand scientific concept and principles which the students study in their theory classes. They perform experiments and get a chance to have a hands-on experience or further development of cognitive domain.

4.4.4 Anatomy Lab

The Anatomy lab has latest equipment which includes anatomical models and posters etc. for students of all the programs in the Institute. The lab can accommodate twenty five students at a time for the practical work. The facility is utilized for anatomy and physiology and pathophysiology. The lab is open from 8:30 to 15:00 hours, Monday till Thursday and Saturday, Timings for Friday are 8:30 to 12:00. Faculty members are available at all times to assist students to help them utilize the lab resources effectively.

4.4.5 Digital Library

The computer Lab is located on the 2nd floor. The lab is practical resource for stu- dents which allow them to learn and understand concepts of computers and principles. Technical staff and faculty members are available at all times to assist students to help

them utilized the lab resources effectively. The lab is open from 8:30 to 15:00, Monday till Thursday and Saturday. Timings for Friday are 8:30 to 12:00.

4.4.6 Library

The library is equipped with latest books on nursing topics and librarians are available to assist the students. The library is open from 8:30 to 15:00, Monday till Thursday and Saturday. Timings for Friday are 8:30 to 12:00. The books will be issued to the students if they submit their library card. The Central library of DUHS Ojha Campusis open from 8:30 to 1800.
