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A: Instructions to Bidders. (ITB)

1. INTRODUCTION

1. GENERAL

1.1 The fund had allocated towards the scheme "STRENGTHENING OF INSTITUTE OF PHYSICAL MEDICINE AND REHABILITATION OF DISABLE AT DOW UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES, KARACHI". It is intended that part of the proceeds of this fund will be applied to eligible payments under the contract for the PROCUREMENT OF EQUIPMENT / INSTRUMENTS / ANCILLARIES.

2. ELIGIBLE BIDDERS

- 2.1 This notice inviting tender is open to all original Manufacturers, within Pakistan and abroad, and their Authorized Agents / Importers / Bidders / Distributors.
- 2.2 Bidders should not be associated, or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the University to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this notice inviting tender.
- 2.3 Government-owned enterprises may participate only if they are legally and financially autonomous, if they operate under commercial law, and if they are not a dependent agency of the Federal Govt. or Provincial Govt.
- 2.4 Bidders shall not be eligible to bid if they are under a declaration of ineligibility for corrupt and fraudulent practices issued by the any government organization in accordance with sub clause 36.1.

3. ELIGIBLE GOODS AND RELATED SERVICES

- 3.1 The term "goods" includes commodities, raw material, machinery, equipment, and industrial plants; and "related services" includes services such as insurance, installation, training of university staff, and initial maintenance.
- 3.2 The goods manufactured by the bidder or authorized by manufacturer, or their Authorized Agents / Importers / Bidders. The goods without Original Manufacturer Authorization or their Authorized Agents/Importers/Bidders shall not be entertained.
- 3.3 Goods registered with the concerned Authority / Ministry / Department (if applicable).
- 3.4 Goods comply with the Technical Requirements of the Bidding Document.

- 3.5 Goods of current production / model / series, suitable for Pakistani conditions.
- 3.6 Goods conforming to the GMP, ASA or SAE or SSI or DIN or CE Marked or FDA or WHO or European Union Validation / Qualification / Approved standard.
- 3.7 Goods comply with the international rules of safety quality and standard.
- 3.8 Goods comply with the electric specifications of 220V, 50Hz / 60Hz.

2. THE BIDDING PROCEDURE

- 4. Single stage one envelope procedure
 - 4.1 Bids shall be accepted under the single stage one envelope procedure.
 - 4.2 The bids shall be opened in the presence of bidders or their authorized representative at the prescribed time, date and venue.
 - 4.3 The Bids shall be evaluated in accordance with the specified evaluation criteria.

3. THE BIDDING DOCUMENTS

5. CONTENTS OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS

5.1 The Bidding Documents:

In addition to the Notice Inviting Tender (NIT), the bidding documents include:

- i. Instructions to Bidders (ITB):
- ii. General Conditions of Contract (GCC);
- iii. Special Conditions of Contract (SCC):
- iv. Schedule of Requirements;
- v. Technical Specifications;
- vi. Contract Form;
- vii. Manufacturer's Authorization Form;
- viii. Performance Guarantee Form:
- ix. Bid Form: and
- x. Price Schedules.
- 5.2 In case of discrepancies between the Notice Inviting Tender (NIT) and the Bidding Documents, the Bidding Documents shall take precedence.
- 5.3 The bidders are expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the bidding documents. Failure to furnish complete information required in the bidding documents or to submit a bid not substantially responsive to the bidding documents may result in rejection.

6. AMENDMENT OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS

- 6.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Purchaser may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, modify the bidding documents by amendment.
- 6.2 All prospective bidders that have received the bidding documents will be notified the amendment(s) in writing, which will be binding on them.
- 6.3 In order to allow prospective bidders reasonable time to take the amendment(s) into account in preparing their bids, the Purchaser may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for submission of the bids.

4. PREPARATION OF BIDS

7. LANGUAGE OF BID

7.1 Preparation of Bids

The bid prepared by the bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the bid exchanged by the bidder and the Purchaser shall be in English. Supporting documents and printed literature furnished by the bidder may be in another language provided these are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English, in which case for purposes of interpretation of the Bid, the translated version shall prevail.

8. DOCUMENTS COMPRISING THE BID

- 8.1 The bid prepared by the Bidder shall comprise the following:
 - (a) Bid Form;
 - (b) Price Schedule:
 - (c) Documentary evidence to the effect that the Bidder is eligible to bid and is qualified to perform the Contract if its bid is accepted;
 - (d) Documentary evidence to the effect that the goods to be supplied by the Bidder are eligible goods and related services as defined in clause-3 and conform to the bidding documents; and
 - (e) Bid Security.

9. BID PRICES

- 9.1 The prices and discounts quoted by the Bidder in the Bid Form and in the Price Schedules shall conform to the requirements specified below.
- 9.2 All items in the Schedule of Supply must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules. If a Price Schedule shows items listed but not priced, their prices shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other items. Items not listed in the Price Schedule shall be assumed not to be included in the Bid.

- 9.3 The price to be quoted in the Bid Form shall be the total price of the Bid excluding any discounts offered.
- 9.4 The Bidder shall quote any unconditional discounts and the methodology for their application in the Bid Form.
- 9.5 Prices proposed in the Price Schedule Forms for Goods, shall be disaggregated, when appropriate. This disaggregation shall be solely for the purpose of facilitating the comparison of Bids by the Purchaser. This shall not in any way limit the Purchaser's right to contract on any of the terms offered:
 - (a) Price Schedule For Goods offered from within the Purchaser's country:
 - (i) Detailed Specification of Stores
 - (ii) Model / Cat No.
 - (iii) Name of Manufacturer.
 - (iv) Country of Origin
 - (v) Quantity of Stores
 - (vi) Unit
 - (vii) the unit price of the goods quoted on delivered duty paid (DDP) basis, including all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable on the components and raw material used in the manufacture or assembly of goods, or on the previously imported goods of foreign origin;
 - (viii) If there is no mention of taxes, the offered/quoted price will be considered as inclusive of all prevailing taxes/duties. The benefit of exemption from or reduction in the GST or other taxes during the contract period shall be passed on to the Purchaser; and
 - (ix) the total price for the item.
 - (b) Price Schedule For Goods offered from outside the Purchaser's country:
 - (i) Detailed Specification of Stores
 - (ii) Model / Cat No.
 - (iii) Name of Manufacturer.
 - (iv) Country of Origin
 - (v) Quantity of Stores
 - (vi) Unit
 - (vii) Currency of Bid
 - (viii) the unit price of the goods quoted on C&F / CFR / CNF / CPT basis (Karachi Port), in the Purchaser's country;
 - (ix) the total price for the item in foreign currency.
- 9.6 Final Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the Contract and not subject to variation on any account. A

Bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation shall be treated as nonresponsive and shall be rejected.

9.7 If it is proved during the contract period that Bidder has supplied the contracted item(s) to any other purchasing agency in Pakistan at the prices lower then the contracted prices, the balance amount will be deducted from the bill and / or security deposit of the contractor.

10. BID CURRENCIES

- 10.1 Prices shall be quoted in Pakistani Rupees for goods offered within the purchaser's country on delivered duty paid (DDP).
- 10.2 Price shall be quoted in foreign currency for goods offered outside the purchaser's country on C&F / CFR / CNF / CPT Basis.

11. DOCUMENTS ESTABLISHING BIDDER'S ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATION

- 11.1 The documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted shall establish to the Purchaser's satisfaction:
 - (a) that, in the case of a Bidder offering to supply goods under the contract which the Bidder did not manufacture or otherwise produce, the Bidder has been duly authorized by the goods' Manufacturer or producer to supply the goods in the Purchaser's country;
 - (b) that the Bidder has the financial, technical, and production capability necessary to perform the contract;
 - (c) that, in the case of a Bidder not doing business within the Purchaser's country, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an Agent in that country equipped, and able to carry out the Bidder's maintenance, repair, and spare parts-stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications; and
 - (d) that the Bidder meets the evaluation & qualification criteria of bidding document.

12. DOCUMENTS ESTABLISHING GOODS' ELIGIBILITY AND CONFORMITY TO BIDDING DOCUMENTS

- 12.1 Pursuant to ITB Clause 8, the Bidder shall furnish, as part of its bid, documents establishing the eligibility and conformity to the bidding documents of all goods and services which the Bidder proposes to supply under the contract.
- 12.2 The documentary evidence of the eligibility of the goods and services shall consist of a statement in the Price Schedule of the country of origin of the goods and services offered which shall be confirmed by a certificate of origin issued at the time of shipment.

- 12.3 The documentary evidence of conformity of the goods and services to the bidding documents may be in the form of literature, drawings, and data, and shall consist of:
 - (a) a detailed description of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the goods; and
 - (b) an item-by-item commentary on the Purchaser's Technical Specifications demonstrating substantial responsiveness of the goods and services to those specifications, or a statement of deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Technical Specifications.
- 12.4 For purposes of the commentary to be furnished pursuant to ITB Clause 12.3(b) above, the Bidder shall note that standards for workmanship, material, and equipment, as well as references to brand names or catalogue numbers designated by the Purchaser in its Technical Specifications, are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive. The Bidder may substitute alternative standards, brand names, and/or catalogue numbers in its bid, provided that it demonstrates to the Purchaser's satisfaction that the substitutions ensure substantial equivalence to those designated in the Technical Specifications.

13. BID SECURITY

- 13.1 The Bidder shall furnish, as part of its proposal, a Bid Security in the amount and currency specified in the Bid Data Sheet and SCC. Unsuccessful bidders' Bid Security will be returned soon after approval of the successful Bidder. The successful Bidder's Bid Security will be discharged upon signing of contract and furnishing the Performance Security bond, duly guaranteed by a scheduled bank.
- 13.2 The Bid Security shall remain valid for a period of 28 days beyond the bid validity period.
- 13.2 The Bid Security is required to protect the Purchaser against the risk of Bidder's conduct, which would warrant the Security's forfeiture;
- 13.3 The Bid Security may be forfeited:
 - (a) if a Bidder withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity; or
 - (b) in the case of a successful Bidder, the Bidder fails:
 - (i) to sign the Contract; or
 - (ii) to complete the supplies in accordance with the General Conditions of Contract.

14. BID VALIDITY

- 14.1 Bids shall remain valid for 90 days from the date of its opening. A bid valid for a shorter period shall be treated as non-responsive and rejected.
- 14.2 The Purchaser shall ordinarily be under an obligation to process and evaluate the bids within the stipulated bid validity period. However, for any reasons to

be recorded in writing, if an extension is considered necessary, all those who have submitted their bids shall be asked to extend their respective bid validity period.

15. ALTERNATIVE BIDS

15.1 If any bidder elects to submit alternative proposal(s), complete information on the alternative items including all data relating to technical specifications shall be given as per following table.

5. SUBMISSION OF BIDS

16. SEALING AND MARKING OF BIDS

- 16.1 The envelopes shall:
 - (a) bear the name and address of the Bidder;
 - (b) bear the specific identification Name and Number of this bidding process indicated in the Bid Data Sheet; and
 - (c) bear the purchaser's name and and a statement: "DO NOT OPEN BEFORE," the time and date specified in the Bid Data Sheet.
- 16.2 If all envelopes are not sealed and marked as required, the Purchaser will assume no responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of the bid.

17. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 17.1 Bids must be submitted by the bidders and received by the Purchaser at the specified address not later than the time and date specified in the Bid Data Sheet.
- 17.2 The Purchaser may, at its convenience, extend this deadline for submission of bids by amending the bidding documents in which case all rights and obligations of the Purchaser and the Bidders previously subject to the deadline will thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.

18. LATE BID

18.1 Any bid received by the Purchaser after the deadline for submission of bids prescribed by the Purchaser shall not be entertained and returned unopened to the bidder.

19. WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

19.1 The Bidder may after its submission withdraw prior to the expiry of the deadline prescribed for submission of bids.

6. OPENING AND EVALUATION OF BIDS

20. OPENING OF BIDS BY THE PURCHASER

- 20.1 The Purchaser will open the bids in the presence of Bidders or their representatives who choose to be present at the time of bid opening on the date, time and place specified in the Bid Data Sheet. The bidders or their representatives who are present shall sign the Attendance Sheet evidencing their attendance.
- 20.2 The bidders' names, item(s) for which they quoted their rate(s) and bid prices, discounts (if any), and the presence or absence of requisite Bid Security and such other details as the Purchaser, may consider appropriate, will be announced on the prescribed date, time and venue,
- 20.3 Any financial bid found without the prescribed bid security shall be straightaway rejected.

21. CLARIFICATION OF BIDS

21.1 During the process of evaluation of the bids, the Purchaser may ask a Bidder for any clarifications of its bid. The request for such clarifications and the response shall be in writing. However, no change in the quoted price or substance of the bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted.

22. PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

- 22.1 The Purchaser will examine the bids to determine whether they are complete, whether any computational errors have been made; whether the required sureties have been furnished; whether the documents have been properly signed and linked, and whether the bids are generally in order.
- 22.2 Arithmetical errors in a financial bid will be rectified in the following manner:
 - (i) If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected.
 - (ii) If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words will prevail.

- (iii) If the Bidder does not accept the correction of the errors, its bid will be rejected.
- 22.3 The Procurement Committee may waive any minor infirmity, non-conformity, or discrepancy in a bid if in their view, it does not constitute some material deviation, provided that such waiver does not prejudice or affect the relative ranking of any Bidder.
- 22.4 If a bid is found substantially non-responsive, it will be rejected by the Purchaser. It cannot subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the nonconformity / discrepancy.

23. EVALUATION & COMPARISON OF BIDS

- 23.1 The Purchaser will evaluate and compare the bids, which have been determined to be substantially responsive.
- 23.2 The bids will be evaluated on the basis of Prescribed Evaluation Criteria in this bidding document. However, the financial proposal will be evaluated on the basis of price inclusive of prevailing taxes and duties and bid Security, being major factor, without ignoring the other relevant conditions as well.

24. EVALUATION CRITERIA

24.1 Scope

Local Handling and Inland Transportation: The goods will be delivered on delivered duty paid (DDP) basis at Consignee's end. The bidder has to bear the risk and costs, including duties, taxes, insurance and other charges of delivering the goods thereto, cleared for importation.

24.2 Multiple Contracts

The Purchaser will evaluate and compare bids on Itemized basis or on the basis of a group or a combination of groups in order to arrive at the least cost combination for the Purchaser by taking into account discounts offered by Bidders in case of award of multiple contracts.

24.3 Qualification / Evaluation Criteria

- i. In comparing bids the procuring agency will consider, besides the quoted prices, other factors such as:
 - **a.** Purchase of bidding document as per the prescribed schedule.
 - **b.** Valid National Tax Number (NTN) and General Sales Tax (GST) Registration Certificates.
 - **c.** Bid Security equivalent to requisite amount and shape.

- **d.** Fulfillment of all the terms & conditions of the bid document.
- e. Authorization Letter from Manufacturer of goods.
- **f.** Delivery schedule offered in the bid.
- **g.** Conforming technical specifications of the goods as specified in Section G (Technical Specifications).
- **h.** Past experience of similar nature and complexity.
- i. After sale service facilities available in Karachi.
- ii. **Financial Position:** Soundness of the Bidder's financial position showing long term profitability, demonstrated through:
 - a. Income tax return forms of last 3 financial years; OR
 - b. Bank Certificate showing yearly turn-over for the last 3 financial years.
- iii. **Litigation History:** The Bidder should not be involved in any litigation with the Procuring Agency or any Government (Federal or Provincial or Local or public sector organization) in the Purchaser's Country. The Bidder will be debarred from the bidding process for submitting a false statement.
- iv. An affidavit on legal stamp paper of Rs. 100/- to the effect that the Bidder has not been blacklisted in the past on any ground by any Government (Federal or Provincial or Local or public sector organization) in the Purchaser's Contry. The Bidder will be debarred from the bidding process for submitting a false statement
- v. The Bidder must indicate the model, catalogue number, registration number (if any), country of origin and name of the Manufacturer of each offered goods in the relevant price schedule.

24.4 Quality Assurance

- i) In the case of manufacturer of the goods, the bidder should provide the relevant documentary evidence.
- ii. In the case of a bidder who does not manufacture the goods, the bidder should provide evidence of being duly authorized by the manufacturer, meeting the criteria under this document to supply the goods.
- iv. The goods of sub-standard or low quality will not be considered and rejected as non-responsive.

24.5 Economic Criteria

- i. Deviations from the Terms of Payment shall not be permitted.
- ii.. Deviations from the Delivery and Completion Schedule shall not be permitted.

24.6 Margin of Preference

In supply, delivery and installation contracts in which there are a number of items of Goods, a margin of preference shall be granted to eligible domestically produced Goods in accordance with the prevailing Rules.

- i. The preference margin shall not be applied to the whole package but only to the eligible domestically produced Goods.
- ii. No margin of preference shall be applied to any associated services or works included in the package; and
- iii. Bidders shall not be permitted or required to modify the mix of local and foreign Goods after bid opening.

25. CONTACTING THE PURCHASER

- 25.1 No bidder shall contact the Purchaser on any matter relating to its bid, from the time of the bid opening to the time the Contract is awarded. If any bidder wishes to bring additional information to the notice of the Purchaser, it may do so in writing.
- 25.2 Any direct or indirect effort by a bidding firm to influence the Purchaser during the process of selection of a bidder or award of contract may besides rejection of its bid result into its disqualification from participation in the Purchaser's future bids.

26. REJECTION OF BIDS

26.1 Notwithstanding anything stated here-before after the Purchaser may reject any or all bids at any time prior to the acceptance of a bid. The Purchaser may upon request, communicate to a bidder, the grounds for its rejection, but shall not be under obligation to justify those grounds.

27. RE-BIDDING

27.1 If the Purchaser has rejected all bids, it may move for a re-bidding or may seek any alternative method of procurement under the provisions of the prevailing Rules.

28. ANNOUNCEMENT OF EVALUATION REPORT

28.1 The Purchaser will announce the Evaluation Report and the resultant acceptance or rejection of bids at least three working days prior to the award of procurement contract.

7. AWARD OF CONTRACT

29. ACCEPTANCE OF BID AND AWARD CRITERIA

29.1 The bidder with lowest evaluated bid under clause 23, 24 & 25, if not in conflict with any other law, rules, regulations or policy of the Government, will be awarded the contract within the original or extended period of bid validity.

30. PURCHASER'S RIGHT TO VERY QUANTITIES

30.1 The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity of stores originally specified in the Price Schedule and Schedule of Requirements without any change in unit price or other terms and conditions.

31. LIMITATIONS ON NEGOTIATIONS

- 31.1 The purchaser reserves the right to hold negotiation of rates, delivery schedule or completion schedule for all the items or any item.
- 31.2 Negotiations will not be used to change substantially:
 - i. the technical quality or details of the requirement, including the tasks or responsibilities of the bidder or the performance of the goods;
 - ii. the terms and conditions of the Contract and;
 - iii. anything affecting the crucial or deciding factors in the evaluation of the proposals / bid and / or selection of successful bidder..

32. NOTIFICATION OF AWARD

32.1 Prior to the expiry of the original or extended period of bid validity, the successful bidder will be informed in writing of acceptance of its bid by the Purchaser.

33. SIGNING OF CONTRACT

- While conveying acceptance of bid to the successful bidder, the Purchaser will send the bidder Contract Form provided in the bidding documents, incorporating all points of agreement between the Parties.
- 33.2 After the official announcement of the award, both the successful Bidder and the Purchaser will sign and date the Contract on legal stamp paper valuing 0.35% of the value of contract, the cost of which will be borne by the bidder, as per article 22-A (Contract) of the schedule of stamp act 1899. In case the successful Bidder, after completion of all codal formalities, shows inability to sign the Contract, its Bid Security shall be forfeited. The firm may also be blacklisted from taking part in any future bidding of purchaser for a period upto five Years or more. In such a situation, the Purchaser may make the award to the next lowest evaluated responsive bidder or move for re-bid.

34. PERFORMANCE SECURITY

- 34.1 One day before the date of signing of the Contract, the successful Bidder shall furnish Performance Security in line with the Performance Security Form provided with the bidding documents. Upon submission of Performance Security the Bid Security will be returned to the Bidder. The amount of Performance Security is specified at Clause 3 in the Special Condition of Contract.
- 34.2 Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with any of the requirements specified in this document shall be considered as sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award and forfeiture of the Bid Security, in which event the Purchaser may make the award to the next lowest evaluated Bidder at the risk and cost of the former.

35. CORRUPT OR FRAUDULENT PRACTICES

- 35.1 (a) the Purchaser and the Bidders / Manufacturers / Contractors are expected to observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the Contract. In pursuance of this policy, the relevant terms / phrases as may apply are defined below:
 - (i) "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in Contract execution; and
 - (ii) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a Contract to the detriment of the Purchaser, and includes collusive practice among Bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non competitive levels and to deprive the Purchaser of the benefits of free and open competition;
 - (b) the Purchaser will take all possible administrative / legal measures if it is found that the Bidder recommended for award was / is engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practice(s) before or after signing of the contract resulting into the conviction of the proprietor under criminal case besides blacklisting of the firm either indefinitely or for such period of time as may be determined by the Purchaser.
 - (c) will declare a firm ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, for the award of a Contract if it, at any time, determines that the firm has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing a Contract.

B: General Conditions of Contract (GCC)

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 In this Contract, the following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
 - (a) "The Contract" means the agreement entered into between the Purchaser and the Bidder, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the Parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - (b) "The Contract Price" means the price payable to the Bidder under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its Contractual obligations.
 - (c) "Goods" means all of the commodities, raw material, machinery and equipment, and/or other materials that the Supplier is required to supply to the Purchaser under the Contract.
 - (d) "Related Services" means the services incidental to the supply of the goods, such as insurance, installation, training and initial maintenance, printing of special instructions on the label and packing, design and logo of the Purchaser, transportation of goods up to the desired destinations and other such obligations of the Bidder covered under the Contract.
 - (e) "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract contained in this section.
 - (f) "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
 - (g) "The Purchaser" means the Dow University of Health Sciences, Karachi.
 - (h) "The Bidder" means the individual or firm supplying the goods under this Contract.
 - (i) "Day" means official working day excluding national holidays.

2. APPLICATION

2.1 These General Conditions shall apply to the extent that they are not inconsistent with provisions of other parts of the Contract.

3. STANDARDS

3.1 The goods supplied under this Contract shall conform to the standards mentioned in the Technical Specifications and goods eligibility criteria.

4. USE OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION

- 4.1 The Bidder shall not without the Purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the Contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern; sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the Purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the Bidder in the performance of the Contract. Disclosure to such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only, as far as may be' necessary, to such performance and not further or otherwise.
- 4.2 Any document, other than the Contract itself, shall remain the property of the Purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) on completion of the Bidder's performance under the Contract.
- 4.3 The Bidder shall permit the Purchaser to inspect the Bidder's accounts and records relating to the performance of the Supplies.

5. PATENT RIGHTS

5.1 The Bidder shall indemnify the Purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the Goods or any part thereof in the country.

6. ENSURING STORAGE ARRANGEMENTS

6.1 To ensure storage arrangements for the intended supplies, the Bidder shall inform the Purchaser at least two weeks prior to the arrival of the consignments at its store/warehouse. However, in case no space is available at its store/warehouse at the time of supply, the Purchaser shall, seven days prior to such a situation, inform the Bidder, in writing, of the possible time-frame of availability of space by which the supplies could be made. In case the Bidder abides by the given time frame, he will not be penalized for delay.

7. INSPECTIONS, TESTS AND TRAINING

- 7.1 The Purchaser or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or test the goods to confirm their conformity to the Contract specifications at the cost payable by the Bidder.
- 7.2 The Purchaser's right to inspect, test and, where necessary, reject the goods either at Bidder's premises or upon arrival at Purchaser's destinations shall in no way be limited or waived by reasons of the goods having previously been inspected, tested, and approved by the Purchaser or its representative prior to the goods shipment from the manufacturing point.

7.3 Any specialized training required for the smooth operation of the goods shall be the responsibility of the Bidder.

8. DELIVERY AND DOCUMENTS

8.1 The Bidder shall in accordance with the terms specified in the Schedule of Requirements make delivery of the goods. Details of documents to be furnished by the Bidder are specified in SCC.

9. INSURANCE

9.1 The goods supplied under the Contract shall be delivered to the Purchaser after the payment of all taxes and customs duty, cess, octroi charges etc. Risk will be transferred to the Purchaser only after the delivery of these goods has been made to the Purchaser. Hence, payment of insurance premium, if any, shall be the responsibility of the Bidder.

10. TRANSPORTATION

- 12.1 The term period of warranty / guarantee mean the period of twelve (12) months form the date on which the Stores have been put into operation and demonstrated to the University staff. In any case this period shall not exceed eighteen (18) months from the date of taking-over certificate.
- 12.2 During the period of warranty / guarantee, the Contractor shall remedy, at his / her expense, all defects in design, materials, and workmanship that may develop or are revealed under normal use of the goods upon receiving written notice from the University; the notice shall indicate in what respect the goods are faulty.
- 12.3 The previsions of this Clause include all the expenses that the Contractor may have to incur for delivery and installation of such replacement parts, material

- and equipment as are needed for satisfactory operation of the goods at the University premises.
- 12.4 The contactor shall provide warranty / guarantee for supply of kits and chemicals, consumables, films etc. for at least 05 years (where applicable).
- 12.5 The contractor shall remain responsible for providing after sale services even after expiry of warranty / guarantee period and sign a Service Contract including Parts with Purchaser for 05 years (minimum).
- 12.6 In case of consumable items, kits, chemicals, films etc. the contractor shall remain responsible for specificity, efficacy & sensitivity with maximum period of expiry as much allowed by manufacturer.
- 12.7 The Purchaser shall promptly notify the Bidder in writing of any claims arising out of this warranty.

13. PAYMENT

13.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the Bidder under this Contract are specified in SCC.

14. ASSIGNMENT

14.1 The Bidder shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform to another party under this Contract, except with the Purchaser's prior written consent.

15. DELAYS IN THE BIDDER'S PERFORMANCE

- 15.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the Bidder in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the Purchaser in the Schedule of Requirements / Contract Award.
- 15 2 If at any time in the course of performance of the Contract, the Bidder encounters anything impeding timely delivery of the goods, he shall promptly notify the Purchaser in writing of the causes of delay and its likely duration. As soon as practicable, after receipt of the Bidder's notice, the Purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may, depending on merits of the situation, extend the Bidder's time for performance, with or without liquidated damages, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the Parties by a supplementary Contract to be treated as an addendum to the original contract.
- 15.3 Any undue delay by the Bidder in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render it liable to the imposition of liquidated damages.

16. PENALTIES LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

16.1 In case of late delivery, even for reasons beyond control, penalty as specified in SCC will be imposed upon the Bidder / Manufacturer. The Purchaser may consider termination of the Contract in case there is an unusual delay in the delivery of the goods whereby the ongoing activity is likely to be affected seriously.

17. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

If a Force Majeure situation arises, the Bidder shall promptly notify the Purchaser in writing with sufficient and valid evidence of such condition and the cause thereof. The Committee, constituted for redressing grievances, will examine the pros and cons of the case and all reasonable alternative means for completion of purchase order under the Contract and will submit its recommendations to the competent authority. However, unless otherwise directed by the Purchaser in writing, the Bidder shall continue to perform its obligations under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical and shall seek reasonable' alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.

19. TERMINATION FOR INSOLVENCY

19.1 The Purchaser may at any time terminate the Contract by giving written notice of one month time to the Bidder if the Bidder becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In that event, termination will be without compensation to the

Bidder, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the Parties.

21. PACKING

The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage.
